SAFETY AND STABILITY ~ A FOUNDATION AT RHK

Where did the summer go? It seems time moves faster and faster as each year passes.

The kids are gearing up to go back to school and most of them have not stepped foot into a school building for about a year. Some of the kids are excited to go back and resume some normalcy while others are very apprehensive. They are scared the schools will shut down again and they will have to try and adjust to online learning once again.

As I was talking with some of our teens, they admitted they did not learn anything last year through online. They did not keep up with their schoolwork and are scared they are too far behind now. This is an overwhelming feeling because many of our kids were already struggling academically and now more pressure is added to catch up.

One teen girl confided in me and said she doesn't even like to be around people anymore and has turned into a loner and isolates. This breaks my heart because I could see her spirit has been broken. I told her how excited WE are to have her back at Rock House Kids and that she was missed terribly! She told me she is not sure how often she will come because it makes her uncomfortable to be around everyone and it is difficult for her to get comfortable. Another teen said he feels like he has been left alone and has no one to have his back when he is not at RHK.

One of our teen girls had the opposite reaction. She said she cannot wait to be around people again. She was feeling so alone and depressed because she could not see her friends every day at school. Another teen said he was grateful RHK has been open so he is able to be with his "family" because when he is not at RHK, he feels alone.

Our next generation is suffering. Suffering because of no fault of their own. Now is the time to stand up for our kids! Stand up to help them navigate through all they have gone



through this past year and a half. They need adults in their life to show them they are NOT alone and let them know it is okay to be confused and not understand.

With that said, we need more people to join the RHK family to come alongside our kids. These are just a few of the kids who have spoken out about their feelings but how many more have not said anything? This makes me think of our little ones. They may not understand why they are feeling what they are feeling. They may not know how to express what they are feeling. All they know is they feel scared, frustrated, and know things are not as they once were.

At RHK's we try to keep things as "normal" as possible for the kids. Doors open at 5:00pm. Dinner is at 5:45pm. Chapel is at 6:30 pm. Class time is 7:00pm – 8:00pm. Food bags are handed out at 8:00pm. Night after night, this is our routine.

Kids find safety in the routine and consistency. Kids find safety in knowing their teacher will be there every week for them. They find safety in knowing they can have a ride from the West side if they call in. They find safety knowing the same people are picking them up week after week.

Are you the next person who can be a constant in a child's life? We need van drivers so we can pick up even more children who need to have a place to come for stability.



Are you the next mentor who can help build self-worth in a child and show them the love of Christ? As we are working to raise support for the expansion, we also need raise awareness for the need for more volunteers. The expansion will allow us to be able to welcome EVERY age group, EVERY night of programming. This means we will need an additional eighty-five volunteers per week so the children/teens will be able to have the support they need from a caring and loving adult. Along with additional volunteers, RHK will also need additional food providers.


