# FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR...

Easter is in April this year. When better to discuss restoration than at Easter time? The definition of restoration is "the action of returning something to a former owner, place, or condition." Restoration can also be "making something new again or better than their current state."

When a child acts out at RHK, we understand that an underlying situation is causing the behavior. Sometimes, we can put a hand on their shoulder and give them a look that the behavior needs to stop. Other times, we have them go to a timeout area where an adult will be with them. During this time, the child might be screaming, yelling, trying to walk away, banging their head, etc. Once the child calms down, there is always a restoration process. The hope is that the child never feels like they are considered a "bad" kid. The kids are shown patience and love.

One of our 6th-grade mentors recently had trouble with one of the girls in her class. This young lady and her mentor had always had a very good relationship. She always wanted to be with her mentor and followed her around. The relationship was building. Then, on this particular evening, the winds changed.

The young lady acted out. She would not listen to instructions and kept leaving the group. The mentor went to her and tried guiding her back to the group - then it happened. The young lady threw craft supplies all over the floor and refused to do anything she was asked. The mentor needed help. So, our staff stepped in to help. One person went with the young lady, and another with the mentor. The mentor said she did not understand. She did nothing different with the girl than she had done in the past, but this time, the girl flipped. This was the first time this had ever happened to the mentor, and she felt awful. She thought they had a good relationship. In reality, they do. That evening the young lady was dealing with outside factors that she did not know how to express.

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## **RESTORATION** continued...

We could have kept the two apart for the rest of the evening and then circled back another day, but restoration is such an important part of building trust and relationships. We made sure the two sat down together with a staff member. They talked it out, and a stronger bond formed between them. There were fist bumps, hugs, and smiles. They were inseparable the rest of the evening.

At RHK, we have volunteers go through Crisis Prevention Intervention classes. The last portion of the class speaks about restoring the relationship. Isn't that what Jesus does for us? We may be angry and lashing out, but the Lord never leaves us. He waits and longs to restore us. Throughout the Bible, we see how God restored relationships. Think about the Israelites and all their complaining. God did not disown them. He continued to restore the relationship and show unconditional love.

Psalms 71:20 says, "Though you have made me see troubles, many and bitter, you will restore my life again; from the depths of the earth, you will again bring me up."

Acts 3:19 says, "Repent, then, and turn to God, so your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord."

Jesus is our example and our hope to bring the kids at RHK to saving faith in Christ. How can we not strive for relationships of restoration?

I pray that you and yours have a blessed Easter.
