FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR...

One evening, a volunteer came to tell me a 4th grader, whom we will call Mary, told her something she thought I needed to hear. As the volunteer spoke, you could see the hurt in her eyes. She said, "Mary is very afraid to be at her house and would like to talk to me."

One evening, a volunteer approached me with concerns about a 4th grader named Mary. Mary had confided in the volunteer that she was afraid to be at home and needed someone to talk to. We sat down with Mary to hear her story. She explained that her stepdad's brother had come to their house and started threatening her family. Her stepdad went outside to confront him, but the man didn't leave until there was a fight. He then threatened to come back and hurt them before running away when he heard the police. Unfortunately, Mary's stepdad was arrested in front of her, causing her to fear for her family's safety. We encouraged Mary to talk to her mom and provided her with a phone number to call in case of danger.

The following Wednesday, she was back at RHK. I asked her how she was, and she smiled and gave me the thumbs up. She said everything was better now. Her smile was bright, and her eyes were shining. We saw no sign of the fear on her face that we had seen just 48 hours prior.

I share this story to show the importance of volunteering. If this volunteer did not take the time to build a relationship with Mary, she might not have told anyone about the terror she felt. This little 4th grader would be holding it all inside her little body.

At RHK, we talk about being a safe place for the kids, so they can be kids without worrying about the outside world.

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CHANGING LIVES continued...

Our volunteers have a challenging job, as they serve long hours after their full-time jobs to ensure that each child feels loved and valued.

I asked some of our volunteers why they do it. Why do they come each week?

One said, "I wanted to help, but I felt anxiety about working with the kids. So, I started working as a behind-the-scenes person. I enjoyed this, but as I heard stories about the kids who came to RHK, I kept thinking someone needed to be there for the kids. Kids need to have someone they can rely on. They need examples of what it looks like to care for someone. I answered the call God has for me to be at RHK. While at RHK, I like that we are giving the kids a safe place to be fed, learn about Jesus, and make healthy friendships. Best decision I have made!"

Another said, "Serving at RHK is much more gratifying than the feeling you get from writing a check. Checks are needed but don't hug you back, lend an ear to a child that needs to be heard, or provide affirmations to a child that needs someone to be proud of them."

I know when I work with the kids, I see a child's life change right before my eyes. They may have been very angry and untrusting when they first started at RHK, but they have come to trust, smile, and engage through time. This is a win. I see kids who are being fed both physically and spiritually. Through this, I see them thrive. They are happier and self-confident while at RHK. I get to see kids turn into leaders.

RHK is here to change kids' lives, but in all honesty, the kids change our lives, too.


God is building something special at Rock House Kids.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT - LISA BUBELA

Meet Lisa. She has been a volunteer mentor/station leader at RHK for a year and also serves on our Volunteer Advisory Board.

An immigrant from Belarus, Lisa grew up in Rockford after her family moved to the US in 2001. There is a small Slavic community in Rockford and she teaches Sunday School at the Slavic Baptist Church. She has also worked with special education in the RPS 205 district for four years.

When asked why she decided to volunteer at RHK, Lisa said: "When I started working in the public schools, I saw first-hand the needs of children in our community, and it broke my heart. I realized while I could provide for their academic needs in school, what these children really needed was the gospel. I prayed about what I could do since I couldn't tell my students about Jesus at school. One day at work, a student was running through the hallways. He stopped when he saw me to ask: 'Do you go to Rock House?' He must have confused me with another volunteer, but his simple question was the push I needed to start volunteering at RHK. This opportunity was the answer to my prayers."



She shares: "One night we were talking about how Jesus gives us peace. I asked the students to think about what makes them feel at peace. Some of the students talked about a friend, a place, or a parent, but one student said being at Rock House Kids made him feel at peace. His words reminded me of how important it is for these kids to have a place like RHK, and showed me that God is using RHK to work in their hearts."

What keeps her coming back? Making relationships with the kids and strengthening those relationships every time she sees them. She is so thankful that these kids have let her be a part of their life even when just a year ago she was a stranger to so many of them. She loves being in a place where people from all walks of life, from all over the city, come together to bring glory to God.


We are excited to add a new stop to our big Eats Tour this month. You can't beat the burgers at Red Robin and who doesn't love their bottomless steak fries? Yum!
