FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR...

Can change really happen? Do careful programming, solid support, prayer, and hundreds of hours of intentional interaction with kids and teens make a difference?

Please allow me to vent a bit. During my ten years at RHK, I've been asked many questions and heard even more comments. Many times, I've been questioned about why we bother working with kids at RHK. Here is just a sampling of what I've heard:

- "'Those' kids don't listen."
- "They only want to be at RHK to get 'stuff'."
- "They won't change."

Feedback like this breaks my heart because it doesn't tell the whole story. Allow me to share some "snapshots" of what happened at RHK Winter Camp, March 1-2 at Camp Timber-lee in East Troy, Wisconsin. Then, reach your own conclusions about why we bother to do this work.

Friday at 5:00 pm, the excitement began. Our teens started showing up at RHK for our weekend adventure. We filled our bellies with pizza and then piled into the RHK vans to head north. Each year when we prepare for camp, we never know what to expect; this year was no different. Once we arrived at camp and everyone was settled into their rooms, we regrouped to have fun snacking, playing 9-Square, Gaga Ball, and singing karaoke. This allowed the kids to let off some energy after the long bus trip.

The next stop was the Chapel for a time of worship, singing, dancing, and teaching. You could feel the excitement in the air. When it was time for our guest speaker to teach, everyone settled in to listen. Well, maybe not everyone. Some kids sitting in front of our group were talking, not paying attention at all. They were quite a distraction. I watched as our RHK kids were quiet and listened to the speaker's words. I have to say it was a proud "mama" moment for me.

Lack of attention and misbehavior are not a "these kids" problem. The same behaviors others have pointed out at RHK are prevalent throughout our society. People have lost respect for one another and even for themselves. There has been a loss of grace for others. What happened to "err on the side of mercy"? People have lost the art of putting others first. RHK kids are taught there is a time to be silly and crazy, and there is a time to rein it in and get down to business.

One of our high school seniors was so frustrated with the noisy kids in front that he told them to "be quiet!" The look on the other kids' faces was priceless. They looked confused that another kid would tell them to be quiet. Our students know we take God's Word and teaching seriously at RHK. Here's the real point: some of our kids are owning those values themselves.

The next day, this same teen was the only kid standing during praise and worship time. He was unashamed as he praised the Lord with uplifted hands. This particular young man has family members who are now incarcerated because of choices they made as gang members running the streets.

By contrast, this particular student has made different, better decisions. He has chosen to come to RHK each week; he decided to come to camp and allow God to move in him. He's looking beyond what he sees going on around him. He's becoming a leader among his peers. He not only has a plan for after high school, but has asked if he could come back and volunteer at RHK. RHK has made a difference in his life—that's not up for debate—and he wants to do the same for others.

On our first teen night back at RHK after camp, the excitement was still with them. They wanted to sing the songs that were sung at camp, and they sang loud and proud. When asked about camp and what they learned, they could tell us.

I have many phone calls, texts, and visits from kids who already have gone through RHK. When they check in with us later, EVERY one of them says the same thing: their time at RHK made a positive difference.

At so many points along the road when I'm at my end physically and mentally, God shows up and throws a blessing like this. Camp is a planted seed in their memories that kids go back to time and time again. They grow up, but when they return, they always have a positive memory to share: proof that the RHK impacted who they are today.

This is why we "bother".
